IT'S THE LAW

Ontario is now enforcing accessibility Standards

All businesses in Ontario are required to comply with the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA).

The first, Accessibility Standards for Customer Service, mandates that by

1 January 2012 every private business in Ontario that provides goods or services to the public and has at least one employee will have to comply. The public sector was required to comply by 1 January 2010. In the coming years, Ontario will introduce standards on Transportation, Information and Communications, Employment Policies and Practices, and Built Environment.
